Timeline

- Before October 6, develop the paper topic and confirm your paper supervisor and committee member(s).
- October 6, 2023: Paper topic approval form is due
 - MPP/MHR/MS-STEP Professional Paper Topic Approval Form
- November 14, 2023: Spring semester registration begins.
 - Register for the PA 8082 Professional Paper Writing Seminar.
 - Scheduled on Wednesdays from 8:15-11:00 am (spring 2024).



Finding a Supervisor and Committee

One of the two must be a member of the <u>Graduate Faculty</u> for your degree. The other could be a community member or faculty member with expertise in your topic area.

- Talk to multiple potential supervisors/committee members to seek advice about your topic.
- You are looking for people who know at least some of the literature you will be reading.
- If you are doing analysis, it's helpful if your supervisor is an expert in that kind of analysis (quant / qual).
- When you find that someone is especially helpful, ask if they would be open to being on the committee or supervising you.
- Give possible supervisors/committee members <u>Information on serving</u> on a <u>Paper Committee</u>. They can also talk to Deborah.



PA 8082 Professional Paper Writing Seminar

- Most students completing Professional Paper in Spring 2024 should enroll in the PA 8082 seminar.
- Students who do not take PA 8082 must submit a waiver request to their DGS for approval before October 6, 2023.
- The Professional Paper Writing Seminar supports students in finishing high-quality, well-written papers by the end of the semester.
- This seminar provides a supportive environment in which students can make regular progress on papers.
- A paper supervisor and committee are still needed.
